World Cotton Day Celebrations

The year 2019 led to launch the initiative of declaring World Cotton Day by the ICAC and WTO, followed by events and celebrations around the world commemorating the importance of cotton crop. Hopefully, the 7th October will soon be declared as the UN World Cotton Day. All of us dedicated to the cause of cotton improvement should be happy with such an international acknowledgement and recognition of cotton crop.

Pakistan being a leading cotton producing country holds responsibility to showcase solidarity with world cotton community. Cotton is not only the lifeline for Pakistan's economy but also has a unique association with mankind. Cotton plant is used in many ways. The lint is used in hundreds of items other than clothing; from currency notes to sails of floating ships or ropes of the anchored ship, seed for cooking oil and meal for livestock; sticks for making boards or burning in stoves and trash as fuel for kilns. It does not stop here and protein is extracted for human and animal consumption and linters to blend manmade fiber and so on so forth.

World Cotton Day celebrations on 7th October primarily aims to educate target audiences on the many advantages of cotton from its qualities as a natural fiber to the many benefits people obtain from its production, transformation, trade and consumption around the world. There are countless ways we can show support for the world's most natural fibre and participate in programs for awareness of community and dissemination of information about the importance of cotton. CCMG Meeting

The 3rd meeting of the Cotton Crop Management Group for the crop season 2020 was held at CCRI Multan under the chairmanship of Mr. Nauman Ahmad Langrial, Minister for Agriculture Punjab. Mr. Wasif Ali Khurshed, Secretary Agriculture Punjab and Mr. Saqib Ali Ateel, Secretary Agriculture, South Punjab also co-chaired the meeting. Agriculture officials, representative from pesticide and seed companies, farmers association attended the meeting. Cotton crop condition, insect pests and disease situation, irrigation water availability and other matters related to provision of subsidy on whitefly specific pesticides, seed, and fertilizers, farmers training programs, crop management under rains, were discussed in detail. Representatives of Pesticide companies assured the required quantity of cotton-pest specific pesticide during the remaining cotton season. Farmers organization complained about the loadshedding, extra billing, low quality pesticides and their mixing, seed quality and germination problems hampering cotton productivity. Agriculture Minister Punjab assured the farmer members for redressal of issues pertaining to cotton production and marketing, pesticide quality, prices and availability for enhancing the cotton production.

An honorary shield was also awarded to Prof Dr Asif Ali, Vice Chancellor, MNSUA Multan from CCRI Multan, upon receiving award of 'Tamgha-e-Imtiaz".

The cotton crop development is at full stage now with maximum number of fruit bearing. The Committee advised the farmers to continue applying fertilizer and irrigation to the cotton crop at this stage. September is the crucial month for cotton crop and efforts should be made to save each single boll. Farmers were also advised for adopting clean picking practices in areas where picking has started.

Annual Review of Cotton Experiments

The performance of research trials conducted by the Plant Breeding & Genetic Section and Cytogenetics Section during the cotton season 2020 was reviewed. Dr. Zahid Mahmood, Director CCRI Multan along with all the scientific and technical staff visited experimental blocks, greenhouse and laboratory work. The respective Sectional Head briefed about the results of studies conducted. The research and development activities focused on climate resilient varieties, insect pests & disease tolerant varieties, excellent fibre quality and yield characteristics, colored cotton program. The experiments on high density trials was also reviewed. Dr. Zahid Mahmood, Director CCRI Multan stressed the scientists for evolution of varieties with desirable fibre characteristics, high yielding with low inputs requirements. He stated that the coming varieties have potential to uplift cotton production in the country.
